Lesson Summary:

Students will each choose a musher to follow during the race. To prepare for the race, they will develop a "Musher Trading Card" with information about their musher and to trade with other students. The research is done via the internet.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Students will thoughtfully choose a musher they relate to and would like to follow during the Iditarod.
- 2. Students will create a musher card to educate and trade with other students.

This will incorporate information gathered and and presentation of the card. Each teacher can choose their own method of evaluation.

Procedural Activities

- 1. Students will choose a musher for the current year using the musher list at Iditarod.com.
- 2. Use the above website and musher website to find out the following information:
 - *Musher's age
 - *Kennel
 - *Where musher lives
 - *What musher does for a living
 - *How many times has s/he run the Iditarod and what is their best finishing time or is the musher is rookie?
 - *Extra interesting facts about the musher
- 3. Using a Word Document, create a trading card. Set up 2 columns to keep card in proportion. Card must have:
 - *Picture of the musher
 - *Information found that was listed above
- 4. When done, copy and paste to make 4 cards on a page. Print on card stock. Cut cards apart. I have each student keep one card; I keep one card for the bulletin board; and they can trade the other 2 cards.
