Lesson Summary:

Students will each choose a musher to follow during the race. To prepare for the race, they will develop a “Musher Trading Card” with information about their musher and to trade with other students. The research is done via the internet.

<p>Procedural Activities</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students will choose a musher for the current year using the musher list at Iditarod.com. 2. Use the above website and musher website to find out the following information: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Musher’s age *Kennel *Where musher lives *What musher does for a living *How many times has s/he run the Iditarod and what is their best finishing time or is the musher is rookie? *Extra interesting facts about the musher 3. Using a Word Document, create a trading card. Set up 2 columns to keep card in proportion. Card must have: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Picture of the musher *Information found that was listed above 4. When done, copy and paste to make 4 cards on a page. Print on card stock. Cut cards apart. I have each student keep one card; I keep one card for the bulletin board; and they can trade the other 2 cards.
