Lesson Summary: Students will be working in small groups. Each group will be assigned a different task relating to the history of the Iditarod. All students will be learning the history of the race.

Learning objectives: Students will be able to illustrate the history of the Iditarod through the use of a technology tool.

Procedural Activities: 1. Students will work in small groups to complete tasks

- 2. Each group will be assigned a different task. Tasks include: Snapshots of history (using pictures to show the history of the Iditarod), Joe Redington, Sr. (students will create a Fakebook profile over Redington), Flag of the Iditarod (students will design and create a flag that relates to the history of the Iditarod), Cartographers (students will design the Iditarod trail using Google My Maps), Musical Iditarod (students will write an Iditarod parody to a song they know).
