Learning objectives: Students will be able to analyze musher data and determine the mushers they feel are the top four.

Procedural Activities:

- 1. Discuss Mount Rushmore. What it is, which presidents are on Mount Rushmore, where it is located, etc.
- 2. Pass out *Musher Mount Rushmore* activity sheet (see attached)
- 3. Students will use www.iditarod.com to research 2015 mushers.
- 4. Students will choose 4 mushers they feel deserve the honor to be part of their *Musher Mount Rushmore*.
- 5. Students will defend their choice for each musher using factual evidence.
- 6. Using the website <u>www.tinyurl.com/mountrush</u> students will upload 4 pictures to represent their musher on the *Face in Hole Mount Rushmore*.
- 7. Present to class students will present their *Musher Mount Rushmore* to the class and explain why they chose each musher.
