**Lesson Summary:** Students will research the different cultures of Alaska. After researching students will create a virtual museum showcasing different exhibits representing the different cultures.

Learning objectives: Students will be able to identify the different distinct cultures of Alaska.

#### **Procedural Activities:**

- 1. Display map of Alaska showing the different cultures
- 2. Discuss with students if they think where the culture is located has to do with its history and culture
- 3. Explain to students they will be choosing 4 cultures to research. Let them know they will be creating a virtual museum showcasing different exhibits of their cultures.
- 4. Pass out Alaska Culture Rubric
- 5. Students will begin working in their groups researching the culture of Alaska
- 6. After researching students will begin developing their museum
- 7. "Curators" will take the class on a tour of their museum
