Lesson Summary

In this lesson students will learn about Veterans Day, how it connects to Iditarod, and how they can use their gifts and talents to honor our Veterans.

Procedural Activities:

1.) Begin by asking your students if they know what a veteran is, and if they know anyone who is a US veteran.

2.) Use the handouts or powerpoint (they have the same information on them) to go over what Veterans Day is and how it connects to the Iditarod.

3.) Discuss how Rick Casillo uses his love of Iditarod to help better the lives of combat veterans. Lead students in a discussion on how they can use their gifts and talents to honor our veterans. Some examples... paint a picture for a veteran, write a card, read them a story, etc.

4.) Have students reflect quietly on how they can honor our veterans. They can fill out one of the handouts to help get their thoughts written down.

5.) Have students carryout their act of kindness to a veteran or veterans. A week or so after veterans day have a class discussion on what students did and how it made them feel.
