Lesson Summary: Students will choose "just Right books" with a focus on the Iditarod race using
personal interests and guided reading levels to find a text that will the best fit for them.
Students will read and discuss in small groups ultimately creating a culminating product that
will showcase their knowledge.

- 1. Choose appropriate leveled text focused on Iditarod topic -- read aloud
- 2. Teach Mini Lessons Highlighting discussion strategies and assigned roles.
- 3. Discussion group: Discuss text, referring to the text and written responses to guide discussion.
- 4. Culminating Activity: Choose one of the following to create and showcase to the class.
 - Poster advertising the book
 - Readers theatre of the book
 - Report on author's life
 - Collages representing different characters
 - An advertising campaign for the book
 - A board game based on the book
 - A song, poem, diorama or piece of art interpreting the book

Materials Students Need:

Reading materials (chosen book).

Paper and pencil for journaling and completing written pieces.

Laptop, iPad, or other device with the ability to access online documents, brainstorm, research and create Culminating Activity.

Art mediums as needed.
