Lesson Plan Title: Joe Redington's Dog "Feets" 2

Discipline / Subject: Reading

Topic: Comprehension strategy of sequencing

Grade Level: K, 1 or 3rd – 6th

Resources / References / Materials Teacher Needs: Iditarod, The First Ten Years book

Lesson Summary: Students will read various articles about the dog, Feets, and create a sequential timeline of highlights in the dog's life.

Procedural Activities

- 1. At a center during reading, have the *Iditarod*, *The First Ten Years* book, or type up the stories and place in Google Classroom
- 2. Post assignment
- 3. Students read pages 163, 164, 275, 276 about the life of Feets, a favorite Joe Redington, Sr. dog.
- 4. As students read, they should take notes and write the events of Feets' life in sequence. From this, they can create a timeline of events in sequence.

Materials Students Need: Clean sheet of paper or a section of adding machine thin, long paper

Technology Utilized to Enhance Learning: Students could create a group Google Slide show or Power Point illustrating the sequential events in the life of Feets
