# Iditarod Encyclopedia

Discipline / Subject: Language Arts - Reading and Writing

Topic: Iditarod Class Book ("Encyclopedia") Creation

Grade Level: Elementary - Grades 1-5 - could be adapted for older students

### **Resources / References / Materials Teacher Needs:**

- www.iditarod.com
- Alphabet book such as "L is for Last Frontier" by Carol Crane (excellent book)!
- Encyclopedia Page Template
- All materials used in your writer's workshop
- Example of an encyclopedia to show the class

## **Lesson Summary:**

- In this lesson, the students will create a class book ("Encyclopedia") that could be used with future classes to introduce concepts of the Iditarod/mushing
- This will be done by conducting short research projects on a topic of their choice, starting with the letter they choose
- The writing process will also be practiced during this lesson

## **Standards Addressed: (Local, State, or National)**

  - a. Introduce a topic and group related information together; include illustrations to aid comprehension, if needed.

  - d. Provide a concluding statement or section.

## **Learning objectives:**

- Students will conduct a short research project on one aspect of the Iditarod/mushing that starts with a certain letter of the alphabet
- 2. The topic chosen is up to them, as long as it starts with that letter
- Students will use the writing process (drafting, revising, editing, publishing) for their topic
- 4. A class book ("Encyclopedia") will be the final product

#### **Assessment:**

 Final product will be evaluated for writing mechanics and content

#### **Procedural Activities**

- 1. Share the book "L is for Last Frontier" or similar picture/alphabet book examine the set-up and content of the book
- 2. Begin by discussing what an "encyclopedia" is and what it is used for
  - a. Talk about the relation to doing a "google search"
- 3. Explain to the class that they will be doing something similar but about the Iditarod
- 4. Students will pick a letter at random from a hat to determine their letter
  - a. if you have fewer than 26 students, take out some of the more difficult letters
  - b. if you have more than 26 students, some of your students with extra learning needs can work together as "co-authors" of a letter OR some can do a separate idea for the same letter if needed
- 5. Students then will brainstorm some topics to research, using background knowledge they may already possess
- 6. With a partner (or teacher) decide on one topic to focus
- 7. Students then begin researching their topic using <a href="www.iditarod.com">www.iditarod.com</a> as the main research tool
- 8. Next, they work to write a rough draft on their topic
- 9. After students have completed the rough draft, then they go through the entire writing process of revising, editing and writing a final draft
- 10. Revising and editing can be done with the teacher or a peer
- 11. Once final draft is finished, students show it to the teacher for final approval
- 12. After the writing is complete, students then can illustrate their topic in the picture box at the top, or on a separate piece of paper (especially if there is more writing upper grades)
- 13. Once all students have completed their page, bind together into a class book

### **Materials Students Need:**

- Encyclopedia Page Template
- Internet access for research www.iditarod.com
- All materials used in your classroom for the writing process (pens, notebook paper, highlighters, etc...)
- Any classroom books/reading materials with relevant information

## **Technology Utilized to Enhance Learning:**

- Word processing
- Internet for conducting research

## **Other Information**

• This lesson is done after the students have built a lot of background knowledge about the Iditarod and mushing (including the Serum Run)

## **Modifications for special learners/ Enrichment Opportunities**

- Enrichment opportunities include completing a second research topic of their choice with a different letter to increase the scope of topics covered in the Encyclopedia
- Students with different learning needs could work with a partner to research a single topic and have co-ownership of the activity
  - o These students could also be given an easier letter to choose from
