

Zuma's Rockin' Resources

Hello Friends, Zuma Here!

Iditarod Fifty-One is right around the corner! I'm so excited to follow the race, I sometimes go right into a tailspin! I'm not sending you on a scavenger hunt this month. Instead, I'm sharing some rockin' resources you can use on your own scavenger hunts during the race. Just click on the blue word links and you're off and running!

Insider, GPS Tracker and Current Race Standings will be front and center whenever you log into www.iditraod.com. Select one of the many Insider videos to see your favorite musher interviewed or hear about trail conditions and race strategies. GPS Tracker lets you see where your musher is, how fast the team is moving and how close other mushers are. Race Standings provide details about arrival/departure from checkpoints, dogs in/out and required rest status.



On the right hand side of the Iditarod home page, there are quick access buttons for **Teacher on the Trail**, **Eye on the Trail and Faces of Iditarod**.

Juli Westrich, 2023 Iditarod Teacher on the Trail™, will post stories and lesson prompts daily starting before the Jr. Iditarod and concluding at the end of the race. Eye on the Trail reporter, Terrie Hanke, writes capsule summaries of race events daily beginning with Jr. Iditarod. Iditarod Photo Guy, Jeff Schultz, shares his astounding Faces of Iditarod collection of photos and interviews of vets, volunteers, mushers, pilots, villagers and canines for everyone to enjoy and get to know the personalities of the race.

Race Map offers more than meets the eye. By clicking on each leg of the race, a trail description written by musher and trail expert Don Bowers Jr. pops up. During the race, Insider photographers share astounding photos from the trail in the Photo Gallery.

Special Awards explains all categories of awards presented on the trail and at the end of the race - Humanitarian to Sportsmanship and Spirit of Iditarod to Red Lantern.

There are a lot of rockin' resources that are ready and waiting to enrich your Iditarod based learning experiences. Dig in and make the most of Iditarod themed education.
