Three Mushers Withdraw from Iditarod 54 Due to Injury

Wasilla, Alaska — The Iditarod Trail Committee, Inc. (ITC) announces that veteran mushers Josh McNeal, Connor McMahon, and Nicolas Petit have withdrawn from the 2026 Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race® due to shoulder injuries sustained during recent training and racing activities.

While these withdrawals are unfortunate, the health and well-being of our athletes, both canine and human, remain a top priority. To help alleviate confusion, it should be noted that Nicolas Petit will participate in the Ceremonial Start alongside his [IditaRider](#) but will not continue on the racecourse after Saturday, March 7, 2026.

The ITC extends its support and best wishes to Josh, Connor, and Nicolas for a full and speedy recovery. They will be missed on the trail this year, and we look forward to welcoming them back to the Iditarod community in the future.
